

## **April 2015 Minutes (corrected) Of Woodlawn Park City Council**

The Woodlawn Park City Council met on April 20, 2015, at Woodlawn Park City Hall. Present were, Mayor Larry Lewis, Council Members, Tom Nunn, Greg Claypool, George Langford, Doug Watson, Donna Rand and Scott Horn, Treasurer Gloria Curran, Attorney Matt Carey, Chief Bob Heaton, and City Clerk Chana Elswick.

The meeting began at 7:01 pm. The meeting was started with the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Council reviewed the minutes for the March 16, 2015, Council Meeting. Doug made a motion to accept the minutes. Tom seconded the motion. All voted aye and the minutes were approved.

Gloria Curran gave the Treasurer's report. She reviewed revenues and expenses, the general ledger and the balance sheet for March, 2015 with the Council. She stated there was \$9025.00 spent for snow removal. George made a motion to accept the report. Greg seconded the motion. All voted aye and the report was approved.

Chana gave the Clerk's report. She stated the records request from a company in California was on hold until they responded about the charge. She did not give the hit report for the website.

Chief Bob Heaton gave the Police report. There were 1 citation, for a dog loose, 17 assists, 0 backup, 110 miscellaneous runs. There was \$103.00 in expenses. He has issued warnings for yard maintenance and mowing. He received a thank you note from the lady that drove her car around City Hall in the snow storm.

### **Mayor's Report**

Larry stated Metro supersedes the City on zoning regulations about signs on buildings. Larry called 311 on the 13<sup>th</sup> and it was turned over to Code Enforcement with Metro. They have 30 days to address the issue. ~~TLD~~ Louisville Tree Co. is zoned residential and Larry asked about it being grandfathered and can they bring in new businesses. Matt and Larry discussed this issue. Larry will call Metro. Greg stated in the past they had to have a gate and keep the trucks parked behind the gate.

Larry stated Brightside had contacted him about sponsoring the corner at 264 at \$2,500.00 per year for 3 years. Tom asked if it would still be done if we did not give the money. Larry stated the \$2,500.00 is a donation to Brightside. The workers are not all volunteers. Doug made a motion to donate \$2,500.00 to Brightside for the upcoming year. Tom seconded the motion and all voted aye and the motion was passed.

Larry stated the AT&T installer came out on 03/25/15. There were some issues with the installation and the equipment. Larry stated we will stay with TWC until this is straightened out.

Larry stated the City Wide yard sale is 05/09/15. It will be sponsored by On the Move Realtors. Larry is trying to get a food truck to come to the City. Donna will try to find some information for a food truck.

Larry stated the Chief had looked at some body cams. They range from \$100.00 and upwards. The Chief will report on this at the next meeting.

Larry stated the Code Enforcement meeting had been held. A ticket had been paid for parking in the yard. 06/01/15 is the next meeting.

Larry stated the excavation had been started at the Woodlawn Center. The leasing agent had said it was upgrading the drainage, but it is for a new building going in. George contacted about the drainage ditch and basin along the railroad track. It had been cleaned and the graffiti was cleaned up also.

Doug and George will be in charge of the sanitation bid. They will advertise for bids.

Larry stated the cap came off the chimney and a bird had gotten into City Hall. The damper needs to be fixed.

## Council Focus

**Welcome** Doug Watson stated had not welcomed any new residents. He showed Council the City Binder for the new residents. The Welcome Committee will meet at 6:30pm, on the next Tuesday. He is going to meet with some businesses for coupons for the welcome binder. He discussed the Chief meeting the new residents.

**Drainage/Sanitation/Streetlights** George Langford stated there were no streetlights out. He checked the ditch by the train tracks as a resident had complained about the trash. Boland Maloney cleaned up the area. A rep from MSD is going to walk the track with him. Larry stated he will go also. A Block Watch Captain has moved, so a new one is needed for Stivers. George went out during the last storm and took pictures of the flooding. Larry stated that if there are complaints about trash cans not being taken in, he will send a letter to the offender. George stated the next Block Watch meeting is June 4<sup>th</sup>.

**City Hall** Greg Claypool stated he had measured for blinds, which he and Larry will replace. Bonnie Duffy has requested to use City Hall for a Pancreatic Cancer meeting once a month. Greg stated he would like the post office to have a drop box in the City.

**Fences and Permits** Scott Horn stated he had received 2 fence permit requests. He has approved 4405 Alicent Court for a fence revision. 4240 Westport Terrace requested a partial fence to block the back porch. They are not ready to install it yet. 705 Beechwood called with a concern about 7303 Kinloch. The Kinloch resident wants to put up a privacy fence inside his existing chain-link fence, per the Beechwood resident. A permit has not been applied for yet. Council discussed this item.

**Streets & Signs** Tom Nunn stated the sign at Ahland and Westport Terrace will be repaired this week. He has received a letter from Hall Construction. Larry stated they won a bid with Metro and small cities can piggyback off the contract. Tom stated he had gone through the City looking for potholes. There are not bad potholes.

**City Pride** Larry gave his condolences on the passing of Donna's grandmother. Donna Rand gave the City Pride award to 6822 Green Meadow Circle, Thomas & Christina Harmon. Larry told Donna she could choose a home, if there are no nominations. The winners will be posted on Facebook.

Greg will get keys made for City Hall. George stated he received an email that Hwy 22 will be open by Labor Day. Larry stated the Red Cross offers CPR and First Aid classes. He would like to offer this to Council and residents. Junk pickup day is May 14, 2015.

Tom made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Greg seconded the motion. All voted aye and the meeting was adjourned at 8:09 pm.
