

September 2015 Minutes (corrected) Of Woodlawn Park City Council

The Woodlawn Park City Council met on, September 21, 2015, at Woodlawn Park City Hall. Present were, Mayor Larry Lewis, Council Members, Tom Nunn, George Langford, Doug Watson, Donna Rand, Greg Claypool and Scott Horn, Treasurer Gloria Curran, Attorney Matt Carey, Chief Bob Heaton, and City Clerk Chana Elswick.

The meeting began at 7:02 pm. The meeting was started with the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Council reviewed the minutes for the August 17, 2015, Council Meeting. Tom made a motion to accept the minutes. Doug seconded the motion. All voted aye and the minutes were approved.

Gloria Curran gave the Treasurer's report. She reviewed revenues and expenses, the general ledger and the balance sheet for August 2015 with the Council. She stated the 4 CDs had matured and were placed in a money market until a better investment is found. All but 21 property taxes have been paid. George made a motion to accept the report. Tom seconded the motion. All voted aye and the report was approved.

Chana gave the Clerk's report. She gave the hit report for the website. She has renewed her Notary Public paperwork and has been sworn in. She mailed a request for information for a student's thesis.

Chief Bob Heaton gave the Police report for August. There were 3 citations- all are paid, 37 warnings, 1 state citation, 20 assists, 4 backups, 125 miscellaneous runs and 1 report for a runaway dog, which has been found. He showed a Courier Journal story about a resident on Middlebrook that has a rare motorcycle. He showed the Council pictures of a panhandler at the bottom of the 264 ramp. He is working on house numbers again. The Police Car lost a hubcap and Metro helped replace them. He will be going to Frankfort with the Mayor to look at surplus cars. Gloria gave him a list of rental properties in the City. Scott asked if he had videotaped speeding on Green Meadow Court. Chief Heaton stated he had not done this as he has been busy with the Walden on street parking. He has spoken to the residents in the past.

Guests Variance request: None

Resident Comments: Garrett and Kitt, 618 Stivers Road introduced themselves to the Council as new residents of the City. Garret has built a "Free Will Library" and placed it at his house. They have these where is originally from. He handed out flyers and invited everyone to stop by.

Mayor's Report

Flag: Larry stated that Don Toomes submitted the City for a commendation with the Sons of the American Revolution, for the flag. The flag will be down until the light bulb is replaced. Scott stated the Scout troop does flag retirement.

City Tow Away Zone: Larry stated there are issues with parking on the street from parents at Walden. He has looked into towing cars. He showed Matt some Tow Away Zone signs that he would like posted at the entrances. Matt stated he can put up tow away zone signs. Larry would like a sign at each entrance. Greg discussed people violating the ordinance. He stated he would like to put a fence at the back gate of Walden. He stated the sign should only be put at the Perryman entrance. Larry stated ~~he will not put the signs~~ *the signs should be put* at each entrance. George stated he is not in favor of towing cars. He asked if Walden would pay for the signs and then allow for parking on one side of the street. Chief Heaton discussed the parking issue. Walden will give the Chief a schedule of events.

Code Enforcement: Larry stated there were 3 out of City citations and all had been paid. There was one issue for a resident ticketed for loose dogs. They would not answer the door, so a certified letter was sent, which was refused. The Chief will ask St. Matthews to help serve the citation. 10/12/15, 11/02/15 and 12/07/15 are the dates for upcoming meetings.

Red Cross: Larry stated a CPR class for \$50.00 per person for 3 hours could be held if Council would like to sign up. He asked if any Council member was interested in being certified. Scott stated he is already certified. No one on Council is interested at this time.

St. MAM: Larry stated ~~a young lady~~ St. MAM's runs a food pantry and provides help with utilities. There will be a dinner and silent auction to raise funds to help the less fortunate. He will post information on the bulletin board.

Solar Power: Larry stated he keeps getting emails about solar panels for energy. He passed out a FAQ sheet about solar power.

State Surplus Vehicles: Larry stated he is going to Frankfort with the Chief to look at vehicles as a replacement for the Police Car. They will be going on Wednesday.

Police Printer: Larry stated the Chief's computer would not connect to the current printer. He now has own of his own.

City Hall Work Day: Larry stated he had planted some azaleas and trimmed the bushes. He would like to schedule a cleaning day for City Hall before bad weather sets in. October 17th is the tentative date, from 9:00 am-12:00 pm.

Goats: Larry stated Matt researched the issue of goats in the City. He pulled the Metro ordinance relating to animals, and goats are permitted.

Council Focus

Welcome Doug Watson stated 2 houses had closed. The one on Stivers had been welcomed, but the one on Kinloch had not. The Chief has a list of new residents for the Clerk. There are 4 houses for sale and 8 pending.

Drainage/Sanitation/Streetlights George Langford stated he inspected the ditch along Stivers and there is still debris in the ditch. He will call Boland Maloney for some help. Larry stated the problem is with CSX Railroad and maybe some comes from the shopping center. George stated that a light was out at 4320 Kinloch. LG&E sent a crew to replace it. He stated he wants to respond to the comments about the ditch, on the bulletin board on the website. Larry stated ~~he does not want to respond on the bulletin board~~ *the proper way to respond is come to a meeting or by phone, not on the bulletin board.* George gave out Block Watch Captain information. The next meeting will be 10/01/15 and a K-9 officer may attend.

City Hall Greg Claypool stated he had ordered the blinds from Home Depot and they should be ready in one week. An electrician will be out to replace the bulbs on the flagpole. He will take the flag down until then.

Fences and Permits Scott Horn stated 4319 Alicent Road built a fence without a permit. They contacted Scott and will have it brought into compliance. They paid for the permit. 4405 Alicent had an addition approved and 6922 Ambridge had a shed permit approved. 915 Perryman wants a horse type fence and Scott will meet with them.

Streets & Signs Tom Nunn stated he got an answer from A-1 concrete leveling for repairing the sidewalk at 803 Cattleya and also to replace the sidewalk in front of 801 Cattleya. He was quoted \$450.00 for 803 Cattleya and \$425.00 for 801 Cattleya. He stated he has talked to other concrete people and it would cost that much or more to replace the sidewalks. Tom made a motion to have A-1 Concrete Leveling repair the sidewalk at 801 and 803 Cattleya, not to exceed \$875.00. Doug seconded he motion. All voted aye and the motion was passed.

City Pride Donna Rand gave the City Pride Award to Doc Hahn at 6807 Green Meadow Circle. She will put a picture on Facebook. She asked to have the Library Box information put on Facebook.

Tom made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Doug seconded the motion. All voted aye and the meeting was adjourned at 7:55 pm.
