

AUGUST 2022 WOODLAWN PARK CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

The Woodlawn Park City Council met in person on Monday, August 15, 2022. Present were Mayor Larry Lewis, Council Members: Mike Brown, Nancye Claypool, George Langford, Tom Nunn, Ed Purcell, and Doug Watson. Also in attendance were: Charlie Veeneman, Pat Merrick, and Attorney Matt Carey.

Mayor Larry Lewis called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a roll call of Council Members.

The Council reviewed the Minutes for July 2022. Tom Nunn made a motion to accept the Minutes and Doug Watson seconded the motion. All voted aye and the Minutes were accepted.

The Council reviewed the Treasurer's Report for July 2022. Mike Brown made a motion to accept the Report and Doug Watson seconded the motion. All voted aye and the Report was accepted.

Pat Merrick had nothing new to report.

Chief Mike Koenig gave his report. City Citations: 0, City Warnings: 19, State Citations: 0, All Assists: 1, Police Backup: 1, Arrests: 0, Miscellaneous: 19, Reports: 0. Gas: \$116.91, Gallons: 27.74. Miscellaneous Expenses: \$40.99. Chief said he's had some complaints of speeders on Perryman Road. From July 23rd through August 9th, he conducted a speed study on Perryman. He placed the speed sign up and the average speed going toward the sign was 20.26 mph and going away from the sign it was 20.91 mph. He will continue to monitor the situation.

Variance Request: None

Resident's Comments: Lee Wilcox, 4317 Alicent Road asked about the zoning change for 4301 Westport Road. The Mayor said since it's not in Woodlawn Park, we had nothing to do with the zoning.

Old Business: Tom Nunn made a motion for the second reading of City Ordinance No. 3, Series 2022-2023. Pat Merrick read the Ordinance approving the use of American Rescue Plan Act funds for road maintenance and police salary increase. The Council voted unanimously aye and the Ordinance was accepted.

New Business: None

Mayor's Report

The Mayor received the post paving bill of \$194,626.00 plus another \$2,000, not quite the \$23,000 they were expecting.

The Mayor asked for volunteers to participate with the Brightside Cleanup on October 22, 2022. Mike Brown said he will provide volunteers.

The Mayor had a meeting with JCLC regarding the Suburban Fire/EMS Proposal. They asked for a percentage of our ARPA funds to fund the project.

The Mayor asked the Council about possibly giving the extra police cruiser to a small city in Eastern Kentucky. After much discussion the Council has decided not to pursue the matter.

Council Focus

City Hall: Nancye Claypool had nothing new to report.

Infrastructure: Tom Nunn reported that a streetlight that was burned out on Ambridge Circle has been replaced.

New Moves and Rentals: Doug Watson report there were no new closings and 1 house is under contract.

Fence and Building Permits: Mike Brown issued Permit #185 to Kirk Andres at 6918 Ambridge Circle for a fence. Permit #186 was issued to George Langford at 6845 Green Meadow Circle for a new shed.

Drainage: George Langford reported he removed debris from a neighbor's yard. He attended the meeting at Eline Library regarding the storage facility. There were about 39 people there. Council person McRaney stated she will vote for the zoning change. He also attended the Muffins with McRaney meeting where she discussed the 2040 Plan.


Community Activities: Ed Purcell had nothing new to report. He is working on the Good Neighbor Award.
